Distinguished guests,

Ladies and gentlemen

Good evening. I express my profound gratitude to the respected Vice Chancellor for inviting me to the concluding session of this International conference on Teaching and Learning 2016 hosted by the centre for Pedagogy at this University. I offer my sincere thanks to Prof Mahbub Alam Pial who technologically made me capable to listen to the keynote speech delivered by Dr Bob Mathew, a Director of Durham University, UK. To me, the importance of this International conference on Teaching and Learning is quite considerable. Our government is making real effort to enhance quality education in tertiary level. With this end in view Higher Education Quality Enhancement Project extends cooperation to our universities through its Quality Assurance Unit. To make students pursue degrees should not be our long-term goal. To make students intellectually sound, globally competent, and highly creative should be our ultimate goal. I, of course, do not forget to instill a sense of humanity in our students.

This is how, we can change our society, we can bring about positive transformation in the world. Mahatma Gandhi suggests for individual change. We need to change ourselves in order to change the world. I think pedagogy is fairly effective for this change management.

I would like to take opportunity to congratulate the centre for pedagogy for arranging this conference. I again express my gratitude to the Vice chancellor for his unwavering support and encouragement.
