Dr Marie-Aimée Tourres is a French economist. She joined Strathclyde Business School, University of Strathclyde early 2014, as Academic Director for South East Asia for the part-time MBA program. Her responsibilities include academic affairs, interview recruitment, MBA group and individual project supervision. She is in charge of intensive seminars such as project methodology and academic writing skills, Topaz business simulation game facilitation as well as MBA workshop Exploring International Business Environment (EIBE) - scenario planning delivery.

Dr Marie is a visiting Professor/Adjunct faculty at GCU Lahore, Pakistan, and Associate Lecturer at Center for Research and Studies on International Development (CERDI), a leading specialized research center in France, and an Associate Fellow at FERDI, its related think-tank foundation.

Her area of specialisation covers development economics, international economics and international business strategy. She focusses on emerging markets, and South Asia & ASEAN+3 economies.

Previously, she was visiting senior research fellow at University Malaya, Malaysia. She also set up Manchester Business School, Malaysia Centre at Sunway University in 2006, and headed it as Director until early 2011. Formerly, she worked for many years as Research Fellow at Institute of Strategic and International Studies (ISIS-Malaysia), the leading think-tank in Malaysia.

Dr Marie graduated in economics from university Pantheon-Sorbonne, Paris, France. She holds two Masters in Development Economics, and in Project Analysis and a Ph.D in Development Economics from CERDI/University of Auvergne, France. She published a book *The tragedy that didn't happen, Malaysia's crisis management and capital controls* (2003), ISIS Malaysia. Besides, she was for a few years columnist for the Malaysian *New Straits Times* newspaper.

She has a strong interest in education in general and economic education and EdTech in particular. She is currently pursuing a Post-Grad Diploma in Academic Practice with Lancaster University, UK.
